Safeguarding: Young Carers

There are probably more young carers out there than you think. They take on extra responsibilities, like dressing the person they look after, cooking, cleaning, shopping, collecting prescriptions. It's a lot to take on as a child. By definition, a young carer is someone under the age of 18 who looks after a family member or friend who has a physical or mental health condition, or misuses drugs or alcohol. They may also look after brothers, sisters or elderly relatives too. Young carers are recognised at the age of 5 years old, however there could be child carers even younger. There are an estimated 800,000 Young Carers in England, but this number could a lot higher as people do not always know the responsibility children have within their homes.



Here at St Clement's Academy we ensure we develop an understanding of the whole child and any support they may need. We work with Spurgeons, who are an organisation that support Young Carers across the city. There is also a nationwide fight being promoted by the Children's Society to get proper support for Young Carers and help them access further education and training. If you think your child is carrying out Young Carer responsibilities or you know a child who is, then please come and see Miss Akers for further advice and support.
