### Help and support with energy bills

We understand how difficult it can be when energy bills start to rise. By making some small, simple changes we can all save money while staying safe and well.

#### Switch off your appliances

Turning off lights and switching appliances off standby when not in use can save £851 year on energy bills.

#### Do not over fill

Only boil as much as you need, overfilling your kettle wastes energy.

#### Save money when cooking

When cooking, put a lid on your pan as this can save you money on your energy bill. Putting a lid on your pan allows water to boil faster and the lid keeps the heat in the pan, rather than letting it escape, speeding up cooking time and helping you use less energy. Slow cookers save money! Slow cookers are an extremely efficient way to cook, you can batch cook meals. Likewise, microwaves and air fryers are also great alternatives to using ovens.

#### Turn down your thermostat

By turning down your thermostat from 22°C to 21°C, you could save £1152 on your energy bills. Wash on eco or 30°C or cooler cycles when you can. Washing at 30°C rather than higher temperatures could save £153 a year

#### LED lights

Switch your lights to energy-friendly LED light bulbs. Replacing all the light bulbs in your home with LEDs can save around £654 a year, lasting five times longer.
