


## Key Vocabulary

<b>World Wide Web</b>	All of the web pages on the Internet
<b>Network</b>	Connected computers
<b>Internet</b>	The biggest computer network in the world
<b>Device</b>	Something that contains a computer (e.g. phones, tablets, watches)
<b>eBook</b>	An electronic books. Can contain words, pictures, sound, links and video
