


Hi Everyone.



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Safeguarding: Hate Crime



Hate crime not only harms its victims, but it also harms their families and communities. The government is committed to tackling hate crime.

We want to raise awareness of what a hate crime is and help people understand that it is not right to target individuals based on their identity.

'Hate Crime' is any criminal offence, which is perceived by the victim, or anybody else, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice towards someone's:

- * Race
- * Religion
- * Sexual orientation
- * Disability
- * Age
- * Status
- * Gender reassignment
- * Gender
- * Family needs (pregnant/not pregnant)

These aspects are known as 'Protected Characteristics'. A hate crime can include verbal abuse, intimidation, threats, harassment, assault, and damage to property. A hate incident is behaviour which isn't a crime, but which is perceived by the victim, or anybody else, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on the protected characteristics listed above.

You can report a hate crime online or call 101 to speak to the police.

Call 999 if you're reporting a crime that's in progress or if someone is in immediate danger.




