Children understanding the rights they have and how they should be treated is a vital part in children understanding how to keep themselves safe. All 54 UNICEF Rights of the Child Articles are available online (www.unicef.org.uk) or in school.

Article 3 -All adults should do what is best for you. When adults make decisions, they should think about how their decisions will affect children.

Article 18 You have the right to be raised by your parent(s) if possible.

Article 29 -Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities. It should also help you learn to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.
