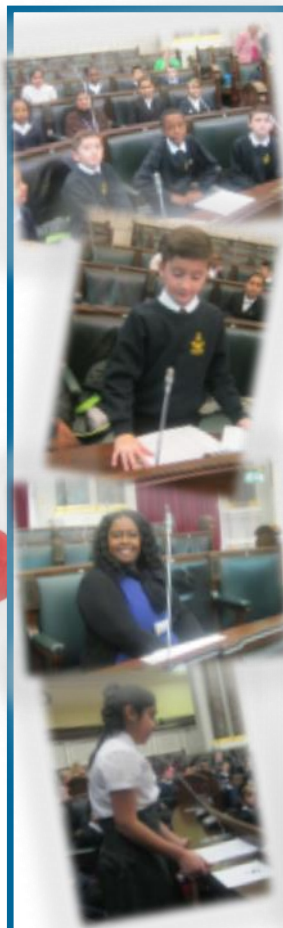
Stuart Street Access to School
