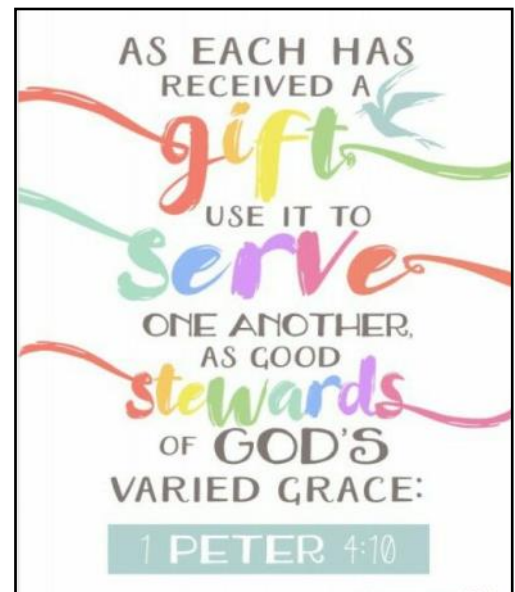
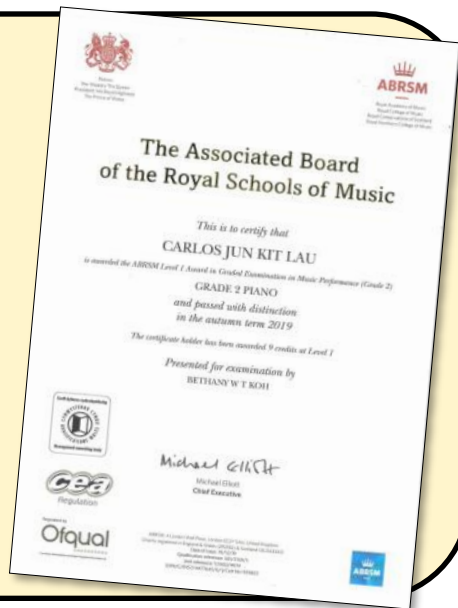
Safeguarding: Children's Rights

Polite reminder: EYFS/KS1 Parents

Dear parents, we understand how frustrating it can be in EYFS and Key Stage 1 when your child doesn't come out of school with all of their personal belongings, such as hats and jumpers.

Although staff try their best to locate all items and ensure your child has their things, sometimes the children put their belongings in unusual places even though we have very specific named places for their things. This makes it difficult for staff to find them.
